Section 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin. Wash

immediately with plenty of soap and water. Transfer to hospital if there are burns or

symptoms of poisoning.

5.1. Extinguishing media
